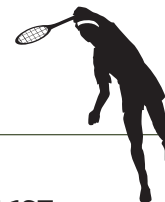
Dear Tennis Code: Although my partner and I play a "friendly" game of tennis we often disagree about what constitutes a foot fault. Could you please help us??
Need to Know

Dear Need to know: The rules state: During the service motion, the server shall not:

- Change position by walking or running, although slight movements of the feet are permitted; or
- Touch the baseline or the court with either foot; or
- Touch the area outside the imaginary extension of the sideline with either foot; or
- Touch the imaginary extension of the center mark with either foot.

Doing any of the above constitutes an infraction of this rule and therefore is a "Foot Fault".

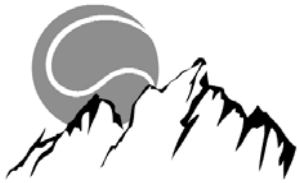

Question: Can plastic tennis ball cans (with the metal lid rings attached) be recycled along with commingled containers? I see many of these in garbage cans at tennis courts, and, from talking to people I know, there is confusion about whether we can recycle these.

Answer from EcoCycle: As long as the tennis ball containers have either numbers 1, 2 or 5 on the bottom, they are recyclable. For the type that have a metal ring attached, however, the bottle can be recycled only if you can carefully remove the ring (please don't injure yourself!). If the metal ring is attached, it renders the bottle un-recyclable.
